

## RESOLUTION NO. R2014.128

### A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TEMPE, ARIZONA, DECLARING THE CANVASS OF RESULTS FOR THE CITY OF TEMPE PRIMARY/SPECIAL ELECTION HELD ON AUGUST 26, 2014.

WHEREAS, a Primary/Special Election was held and conducted in the City of Tempe, Arizona, on Tuesday, August 26, 2014, for the purpose of nominating and/or electing candidates to three City Council seats, and to propose four amendments to the City Charter as Proposition Numbers 473, 474, 475 and 476; and,

WHEREAS, it now becomes the duty of the City Council of the City of Tempe, Arizona to canvass the election results of the August 26, 2014, Primary/Special Election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TEMPE, ARIZONA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Exhibit A, attached, is declared and adopted as the official canvass of votes of the August 26, 2014, Primary/Special Election and includes:

- 1) the number of ballots cast in each precinct;
- 2) the number of ballots rejected in each precinct;
- 3) the titles of the offices voted for and the names of each person voted for to fill the offices;
- 4) the number of votes by precinct received by each candidate;
- 5) the number and brief title of each proposed Charter amendment;
- 6) the number of votes by precinct for and against each proposed Charter amendment.

Section 2. That, as shown in Exhibit A, the total number of ballots cast in the August 26, 2014, Primary/Special Election was 21,751.

Section 3. That the names of the candidates voted for at the August 26, 2014, Primary/Special Election for the office of City Councilmember are:

Section 4. That Lauren Kuby and David Schapira received a number of votes greater than the majority vote calculation in the August 26, 2014, Primary/Special Election, are declared elected to the office of City Councilmember, as of the November 4, 2014, General Election, and are hereby issued certificates of election.

Section 5. That there being one City Council seat left to be filled at the November 4, 2014, General Election, Robin Arredondo-Savage and Shana Ellis, who equal no more than twice the number of candidates for the City Council seat to be filled and who received the highest number of votes, shall be candidates for City Councilmember and have their names placed on the official ballot at the November 4,

2014, General Election. On September 4, 2014, Shana Ellis withdrew as a candidate from the City Council race, prior to the printing of the official ballots. Therefore, Shana Ellis' name will not appear on the General Election ballot.

Section 6. That the total number of votes cast at the August 26, 2014, Primary/Special Election for Proposition 473, an amendment to the Tempe City Charter, Article IV, Administrative Departments, Section 4.02, Merit system, Subsection C, Merit system board, are as follows:

19,028 total votes were cast; 11,725 votes were cast in favor of Proposition 473 and 7,303 votes were cast in opposition to Proposition 473. Proposition 473 is hereby declared to have passed and is approved.

Section 7. That the total number of votes cast at the August 26, 2014, Primary/Special Election for Proposition 474, an amendment to the Tempe City Charter, Article V, Finance And Taxation, Section 5.03, Claims or demands against city, are as follows:

19,259 total votes were cast; 11,837 votes were cast in favor of Proposition 474 and 7,422 votes were cast in opposition to Proposition 474. Proposition 474 is hereby declared to have passed and is approved.

Section 8. That the total number of votes cast at the August 26, 2014, Primary/Special Election for Proposition 475, an amendment to the Tempe City Charter, Article IX, General Provisions, Section 9.01, Prohibitions and penalties, Subsection (A)(1), Activities prohibited, are as follows:

19,859 total votes were cast; 13,553 votes were cast in favor of Proposition 475 and 6,306 votes were cast in opposition to Proposition 475. Proposition 475 is hereby declared to have passed and is approved.

Section 9. That the total number of votes cast at the August 26, 2014, Primary/Special Election for Proposition 476, amending the Tempe City Charter generally to include gender neutral language throughout the Charter, are as follows:

19,829 total votes were cast; 13,054 votes were cast in favor of Proposition 476 and 6,775 votes were cast in opposition to Proposition 476. Proposition 476 is hereby declared to have passed and is approved.

Section 10. That it shall be the duty of the City Council, immediately upon canvassing the votes cast in the election, to transmit a certified copy of the approved Charter amendments to the Governor of the State of Arizona for approval, as provided by the Tempe City Charter and the Arizona Constitution.

Section 11. That the City Clerk shall enter Exhibit A on the records of the City of Tempe as the official canvass.
