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4. Applicant: Arizona State University Gammage

Project Title: Dancing Earth Residency

Project Description: In November 2010 ASU Gammage will present contemporary Indigenous dance company Dancing Earth. ASU Gammage will offer complimentary admission to the Dancing Earth Performance and assistance with transportation for the McClintock High School Dance Department. Prior to the performance teachers will be provided with a study guide which will include interactive lessons created in alignment with the Arizona State Standards.
