Agenda Item: 5C6**

ACTION: Adopt a resolution authorizing the Mayor to execute an Intergovernmental Agreement with the State of Arizona for the design process of the Western Canal Multi-Use Path Extension. (Resolution No. R2016.70)

FISCAL IMPACT: The total design cost for this project is \$163,000 of which the City is required to provide \$9,291 in matching funds. Sufficient funds for this expenditure have been appropriated in the fiscal year 2016/17 Capital Improvement Program budget, Transit Program. The total construction cost for this project is currently budgeted in fiscal year 17/18 in the Maricopa Association of Governments (MAG) Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for \$856,000 of which the City will be required to provide \$62,937 in matching funds.

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt Resolution No. R2016.70.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: The purpose of the Intergovernmental Agreement is to prepare final design documents, including approved environmental, project assessment, and all necessary documents and steps to obligate funding for the construction of an extension of the Western Canal Multi-Use Path from Kyrene Road to the Western Canal along Divot Drive. The project consists of designing an ADA accessible, 10-foot wide concrete path and will look at the incorporation of site features such as gateway points, site furnishings, drinking fountains, planting, irrigation, lighting and way finding signs. Pursuant to the agreement, the state is designated agent of the city for the project and will administer the scoping and design of the project, will prepare the plans, estimates and specifications and will submit the appropriate documents to the Federal Highway Administration. The state will also pursue federal funding in support of the project through the Federal Highway Administration; the city must provide matching funds and carry responsibility for any financial overages.
