
**CITY OF TEMPE
REQUEST FOR COUNCIL ACTION****Council Meeting Date: 10/27/2016
Agenda Item: 5C13**

ACTION: Adopt a resolution authorizing the Mayor to execute an intergovernmental agreement between Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community and City of Tempe for the purpose of accepting and disbursing a portion of Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community's 12% gaming proceeds for 2016. (Resolution No. R2016.107)

FISCAL IMPACT: The City of Tempe will receive a one-time amount of \$1,200,000. Of that amount, Tempe will serve as a pass through for \$475,000. Tempe will receive the remaining amount, \$725,000, for government projects and programs. Sufficient budget appropriation for expenditure of this grant was authorized in the Governmental Grants Fund (Fund 46) as part of the fiscal year 2016-17 adopted budget.

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt Resolution No. R2016.107.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: State law, A.R.S. § 5-601.02, requires participating tribal communities to contribute 12% of their annual gaming proceeds to local governments for government services that benefit the general public, including public safety, mitigation of gaming impacts, and the promotion of commerce and economic development. In the spirit of regional cooperation, Tempe acts as a pass through for Salt River Pima - Maricopa Indian Community contributions to external organizations to which the tribe has awarded grants.

The Salt River Pima - Maricopa Indian Community shall make a one-time payment to the City of Tempe in the amount of \$1,200,000 to be distributed as follows:

\$75,000	to the American Red Grand Canyon Chapter to assist displaced individuals who are involved in tragedies by providing immediate emergency needs such as food, clothing and shelter.
\$20,000	to the Center for The Future of Arizona for Beat the Odds, a mentoring and leadership training program for K-12 principals focused on improving the academic achievement of students in low income, high minority schools.
\$25,000	to Daring Adventures Inclusion Project - Equal Access to Healthy Recreation for Everyone to help expand access to healthy activities for people with disabilities and create volunteer opportunities for the general public that facilitate community inclusion in outdoor recreation.
\$5,000	to the Florence Crittenton Services of Arizona Inc., New Life for At-Risk Girls: Therapeutic Group Home which is a 40-bed residential treatment facility providing 24-hour supervision and care to approximately 200 at-risk girls and young women, ages 10 to 18, annually.
\$100,000	to Hacienda Health Care Inc. for the Drug Dependent Newborn Center of Excellence, the only such program in Arizona and one of just two known programs in the United States which will help drug dependent infants who present medical challenges not found in other infants.
\$50,000	to Indian Legal Services/ASU for the Indian Legal Program Enhancement Project to strengthen a nationally recognized Indian law program and train future attorneys in the field of Indian Law and Tribal Law.
\$130,000	to the Phoenix Children's Hospital the Cardiometabolic Assessment Research and Education (CARE) Program: to support the CARE Program's mission to improve the health and lives of children who have or are at high-risk of developing diabetes and cardiovascular disease, through comprehensive medical management, research, and education.

- \$20,000 to Rio Salado Foundation Enhancing the Visitor's Experience at Historic Eisendrath House: for improved education on the adobe architecture, water conservation and sustainable practices through an interactive website and kiosk.
- \$50,000 to the Salvation Army for the Emergency Assistance Program to provide one-time rental or utility assistance to Valley of the Sun residents who find themselves in unforeseen economic crises: this will allow them to maintain their permanent housing.
- \$725,000 to the City of Tempe for government projects and programs which include the following:
- ADA compliant sidewalk at Celaya Park
 - Eviction prevention services (CARE 7)
 - Implementation of Trauma Informed Care (CARE 7)
 - Youth baseball field
 - Gallery at Tempe Center for the Arts Education Package
 - Museum classroom for early and elementary education
 - Kid Zone Scholarship Program – Getz Preschool
 - Education Programs Support – Cradle to Career Roadmap/My Brother's Keeper
 - Patient Advocacy Service (Fire Medical Rescue)
 - Community Pool Accessibility Program
 - Adapted recreation wheel chair accessible van

Total Disbursement: \$1,200,000
