

**CITY OF TEMPE
REQUEST FOR COUNCIL ACTION**
**Council Meeting Date: 11/03/2016
Agenda Item: 5B7**

ACTION: Approve one-year contract renewals with Hambicki Trucks, Waste & Recycling Plastic Containers, Impact Plastics, and Rotational Molding for the purchase of refuse containers.

FISCAL IMPACT: Total cost of these four contracts shall not exceed \$250,000 during the one-year contract renewal period. Sufficient funds have been appropriated in the Solid Waste Fund – cost centers 3713 (Residential); 3714 (Commercial); and 3716 (Support Services) – for the anticipated expenditures.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the renewal of the contracts.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: (T15-053) City Council originally approved the award of contracts to Hambicki Trucks, Waste & Recycling Plastic Containers, Impact Plastics, and Rotational Molding for the purchase of refuse containers on November 13, 2014 for an initial one-year period with four one-year renewal options. This renewal request is the second of four available renewal options.

The contracts cover the purchase of five classifications of containers and replacement parts as show in the table below:

The containers in these sizes are primarily used for collection of commercial or multi-family complex waste. The City currently has approximately 10,700 containers of these sizes and classifications in use throughout the City. Based on budgeted funds, about 450 of the containers in these classifications are expected to require replacement each year due to wear. The typical life of containers in these classifications is 10 to 15 years.

Rotational Molding has requested a price increase of 2.5% - a result of increasing costs for materials and labor.
