**Agenda Item: 5B2**

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**ACTION:** Approve the utilization of a one-year City of Phoenix contract with Freightliner of Arizona for the purchase of a roll-off equipped truck.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** Total cost of this contract will not exceed \$195,000. Sufficient funds have been appropriated in the Solid Waste Fund – cost center 3715 (Roll-Off Tilt Frame) – for the anticipated expenditures.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Approve the utilization of the contract.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION:** (IFB12-155 City of Phoenix) The City of Phoenix solicited and awarded a contract for the purchase of roll-off equipped trucks which utilized a competitive bid process and contains cooperative language allowing its use by other governmental agencies.

Roll-off containers, which are typically open top dumpsters characterized by a rectangular footprint in 10, 15, 25 and 40 cubic yard sizes are commonly used to contain loads of construction, demolition waste or other waste, and are designed to be transported by special roll-off trucks. The roll-off truck has a hydraulically operated tilt bed with a cable and winch system which pulls the filled container onto the roll-off truck for transport of material to an appropriate disposal facility and conversely lowers an empty container to the ground.



This request is for the purchase of a roll-off loader to replace a 2007 model year unit which has reached the end of its useful life.

**Municipal Fleet Industry Best Practices**

In keeping with municipal fleet industry best practices, the City's vehicle replacement strategy is centered on asset protection and lifecycle cost analysis for each category of vehicle and equipment. This lifecycle analysis involves capital costs, depreciation costs, operating and maintenance costs, and residual value at auction. Fleet Services determines the lowest annualized cost of equipment by category to establish replacement guidelines that provide the lowest overall cost of the City's fleet. The replaced vehicles will be sold at auction to recover residual value.

**Recommendation**

The City of Phoenix contract contains competitive pricing for a unit which is suitable for use in the Solid Waste Fleet.
